Christmas wreath making workshop: Monday 9th December 10.30 -

Join us for a Christmas wreath making workshop led by Claire Waddington. Claire is one of our Art Beyond Vision facilitators and has living experience of sight loss herself, so the workshop has been designed with blind and partially sighted people in mind. All materials will be provided, as will tea, coffee and mince pies!

The cost of the workshop is just £10 per person which must be paid in advance to secure your place. There are just 12 places available so book early to avoid disappointment!

Living Well with Sight Loss course (LWWSL)

Are you newly diagnosed, feeling nervous about navigating the world, or want to start getting out and about more? Feeling like you need a boost of confidence?

- This free, informal, two-day course delivers:
 - Practical advice and local information.
 - Daily living skills and leisure activities.
 - Wellbeing and emotional support.
 - The opportunity to share experiences with others.

A recent course attendee said:

"The course was so useful – lots of information, well presented, and a chance to meet others with sight impairments."

Living Well with Sight Loss is a partnership between WDSA and RNIB, made possible with the kind support of Wakefield Council. Our next course will provisionally be taking place on Monday 20th and Monday 27th January at Lightwaves Leisure Centre, Lower York Street, Wakefield WF1 3LJ (opposite Wakefield Bus Station). Access to Lightwaves is step-free. Places are limited, so please contact the office on 01924 215555 and we will be happy to give you further information.

Art Beyond Vision

The next phase of our fully accessible creative programme, Art Beyond Vision, will be starting on Thursday 7th November and running for six weeks until Thursday 12th December. The sessions will run from 1pm to 3pm. The technique being taught at this course is embossing. This is the art of producing raised patterns on paper. This can be done using hand tools or by creating a collaged

embossing plate and running it through a press. The technique can be used to create greetings cards and paper-based art.

The weekly workshops will be taking place in the Education Room at Wakefield Cathedral, Westmorland Street, Wakefield, WF1 1PJ. The venue is step-free and has accessible toilet facilities.

Art Beyond Vision focuses on tactile techniques that can be used by anyone, irrespective of your level of usable vision. No experience is necessary, and all equipment and materials are provided. The course is run by a qualified teacher with support from facilitators with living experience of sight loss. Previous participants have said:

"I've thoroughly enjoyed the course, and I'm so pleased it has given me the confidence to carry on being creative like I used to be."

"I've looked forward to every Thursday as I live alone. Getting out regularly has been great, helping with my mental health. I've enjoyed learning new crafts and socialising with others."

The next course after this will be starting on Thursday 9th January for 6 weeks, finishing on Thursday 13th February. The technique being taught on this course is beading. This involves creating beaded jewellery and other decorative items. This course will be led by one of our facilitators who is registered blind, and she can't wait to show you what's possible!

Because the funding we have received does not cover the whole cost of delivering the project, we will be charging a nominal fee of £5 per class per participant. This will include all equipment, materials, tuition, and refreshments (tea, coffee, biscuits). If you would like to attend but the cost is difficult for you, please talk to us and we will see what we can do.

Places are limited, and priority will be given to people who have not participated in Art Beyond Vision before. If we are over-subscribed, remaining places will be allocated via random ballot. If you can't make it to either of these courses but would be interested in future courses, please let us know and we will be pleased to add your name to our waiting list.

Cost of living support

The rising cost of living is a big concern for everyone right now. Please don't struggle alone. We have a limited emergency fund available to help blind and partially sighted people who find themselves in financial hardship. Don't lose out on your Winter Fuel Payment

If you were born before 23 September 1958, you could get help to pay your heating bills during winter.

If you receive Pension Credit, then you will be automatically eligible for the Winter Fuel Allowance. An award of just £1 in Pension Credit can unlock more support. Have you checked recently if you are entitled to more support? People entitled to Pension Credit can also get help with:

- Housing benefit
- Mortgage interest
- Council tax support
- A free TV license (over 75s)
- NHS dental treatment and glasses
- Transport costs for hospital appointments
- Heating costs

Advisors from Citizens Advice Wakefield District will be at our Demo Day on Monday 4th November and will be available to help you with FREE confidential advice on the support available for energy bills and Pension Credit.

Not yet retired but need help with money, benefits, or debt? Come along and speak to them anyway! They will be pleased to help.

Partner news: Wakefield Libraries



Everyone can use and enjoy their library! There are many free services available to people who have a visual impairment.

- There is a huge range of books both in large print and audio which you can borrow. You can also download audiobooks, magazines, newspapers and e books, all for free.
- Readers Groups meet throughout the District to chat about books and audio books.
- If you find it difficult to visit your local library due to illness, age, or disability, you can apply for the Home Library Service to visit your home.
- Our Mobile Library has regular stops throughout the District and this is currently under review. For further information please visit https://www.wakefield.gov.uk/libraries-and-local-history/your-local-library/mobile-library-service/.

- Many of our libraries run regular events for adults such as Chill and Chat, crafting, Knit and Natter and author events.
- All our libraries have computers that are free to use (you just pay for printing) and they also have free WiFi.

Joining the Library is easy. You don't need to show any ID and we now no longer charge fines if you forget to bring your books back on time.

<u>Partner news: Beyond Braille – a Dream Time Creative/Forgotten</u> <u>Women of Wakefield project</u>

A unique opportunity to gain research skills from Forgotten Women of Wakefield lead researcher and work together with others to create a timeline of information about the history and heritage of Wakefield District Sight Aid, is open to interested members.

During the Autumn 2024 and again in Spring 2025, beginning with a taster session on the 17th of October at Wakefield One Archives, interested members will be able to explore how to access different and varied research sites over 9 workshops. We will explore a variety of documents to build a picture of the lives of two inspirational forgotten women from Wakefield, Emily Wright and Esther Fennell, and their campaign to empower blind people in Wakefield from the turn of the 20th century.

During Spring 2025 (dates tbc) Dream Time Creative, the arts company behind the Forgotten Women of Wakefield blue plaque parity campaign, will also host 3 weaving workshops with members to share the findings from the research group and encourage conversations whilst weaving our own stories into the looms.

Our team will be putting together a Heritage Walk for next September to share stories from members alongside information the research has uncovered as part of our existing series of Heritage Walks across the city.

Funded by Historic England, the aim of this project is to have a waist height blue plaque in both raised letters and Braille to honour the legacy of these women as advocates of an enlightened and inclusive approach to working with the blind.

Tribute to Margaret Dodd: 3rd August 1945 – 22nd July 2024

Many of you will already be aware that Margaret Dodd, who had been involved with our charity for almost 40 years, sadly passed away in July following a short stay in hospital and residential care.

Margaret came to what was then the West Riding Voluntary Association for the Blind (Wakefield Area) in 1986, running the charity until a cancer diagnosis forced her retirement in 2005. When she recovered from cancer, she returned as a volunteer and continued working with us right up until her death.

There was a period when Margaret ran the charity from the spare bedroom of her home in Stanley when there wasn't enough money for premises and Margaret feared it wouldn't last six months. It is not an overstatement to say that without Margaret's hard work and dedication to the support of the visually impaired community, Wakefield District Sight Aid would not exist today.

Margaret started to struggle with ill-health towards the end of 2023 and was finally diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease in May this year. By this time, Margaret had completely lost the power of speech and was finding communication very hard, but she still attended Sight Aid events and helped us in the office on a weekly basis. We already miss her more than words can say.
